Mary Bloom Center in Peru

The Mary Bloom Center is a medical and education center serving the underserved in Puno, Peru. Named for the mother of Fr. Phillip Bloom, the center promotes the values she exemplified, i.e., marriage, family, children, and faith in God.



To strengthen marriages and families, the Mary Bloom Center staff teaches the Billings Method of family planning to medical professions, married couples and young adults. Below are pictures that illustrate some of the ways in which the Mary Bloom Center aids the underserved in Puno.

Diego Apaza Navarro – Eye Operation

In October 2009, a delegation from St. Mary of the Valley in Monroe, Holy Family in Seattle and Queen of Angels in Port Angeles visited Diego's family at his parents' home. Because of their extreme poverty Diego's parents had not obtained medical attention for Diego. Michelle Palmer, a delegation member and nurse at Seattle Children's Hospital, examined Diego's eyes and stated that he needed immediate medical care.



Obst. Luz Marron, Director of the Mary Bloom Center, took Diego to an ophthalmologist in Puno, and then to Arequipa, a major city an eight-hour bus ride from Puno. The doctor diagnosed him with "Queratocono Queratoconjuntivitis Actinica."



The Peruvian ophthalmologist said that this disease

strikes about one in every 200,000 children and that it manifests itself in adolescence. As you can see from the picture of Diego's eyes, the disease has caused severe degeneration of the cornea. Diego said he experiences blurred



and multiple vision problems. After nearly two months of anti-inflammatory eye drops, Diego received medical intervention on December 15. Luz arranged for Diego's dad to accompany him to Arequipa and stay with him during the time of the treatment. Two days later, he had a second operation on his right eye. In January of 2000, Fidel suffered burns on his face, neck, back and chest caused by a propane explosion. The Mary Bloom Center has helped him with two operations, medicines and various consultations. When he first came for help, his arms were so inflexible that he moved like a robot. He needs a further operation to free his hand to be able to do manual labor in order to provide for his three school age children.

Sor Maritza (director of Puno orphanage for girls) wrote: "We received a baby named Francisca, whose mother also died in childbirth. She was born with a high degree of malnourishment, also is in treatment but we are sure that God blesses us in finding persons like yourselves who help us, otherwise our work would be limited since without economic support very little can be done. Francisca was hospitalized in Juliaca for *enterocolitis necrozante perinatal*. When her mom died, they gave her cow's milk because they had no other option and this caused intestinal problems. She is in our home but we have to be very careful because she is a tiny baby, weighing only two and half kilos."
