

(see picture below) Archbishop Sartain prayerfully led the service and gave an excellent homily based on the Scripture readings for the First Sunday of Lent: The temptation and fall of our first parents – in contrast to the temptation and triumph of Jesus. Archbishop Sartain emphasized that the goal of Lent is reliance on God. During these forty days we accompany our catechumens and candidates as they prepare for the Easter Sacrament – and all of us prepare for the renewal of our baptism. At the Rite of Election the archbishop individually greeted each candidate and catechumen. And it was all accomplished with no applause! The focus was clearly on God and our need for Him.



This prayer for those tempted by abortion is at heart of the season of Lent. Fr. Frank Pavone, director of Priests for Life, made this reflection:

"The traditional practice of 'giving something up for Lent' is a practice of self-denial. It means we say no to ourselves and yes to God and others. This reverses the pattern of sin, particularly abortion, which says yes to ourselves and no to God and others."

Our society presents abortion as a "woman's choice" – as if the man has nothing to do with it. The reality is that, although men cannot have abortion, they can choose abortion by cowardice, selfishness and lack of responsibility. If we are going to move from a culture of death to a culture of life, we need men who are strong, protective and respectful.
